Kyrgyzstan is at the peak of the Eurasian continent, at the center between east and west. Despite being a relatively small country, Kyrgyzstan is home to three peaks over 7,000 m (22,965 feet). This figure is not very surprising, considering that 94% of the country is over 1,000 m (3,280 feet) above sea level, and 80% is taken up by the rugged Tian Shan range. The best way to experience the variety of climate zones is to simply go hiking, since trails pass through coniferous forests, tundra vegetation, high pastures, and rocky mountain peaks.





# Uzbekistan is one of two doubly-landlocked countries in the world. To get to the open sea, one would need to cross two other countries first. The only other doubly-landlocked country is Liechtenstein.


Uzbeks always negotiate prices before buying something. It may seem funny but both sellers and buyers love doing it. Any purchase is not a good purchase if it is bought without bargaining. So, when you look for souvenirs or fruit on the market, make sure you get 10%-20% off the price.

Uzbekistan's signature dish is plov (also called palov or pilaf), a main course classically made with rice, meat, yellow and orange carrots and onions. There are dozens of plov recipes from all over Uzbekistan. Though the same ingredients are used across the country, cooking methods vary from region to region. Try plov in Tashkent, Samarkand, Bukhara, Shakhrisabz, Khiva, and the Fergana Valley and see if you can choose your favorite one.

Samarkand bread does not get stale for many days if stored in a cloth bread bag. Uzbeks always bring bread from Samarkand to their families as a souvenir. The best places to buy bread are Siyob Market and Tashkent Street in Samarkand.

This three-day Aral Sea tour from Tashkent is the best tour for those who want to experience Uzbekistan in full, and go deeper into different aspects of this beautiful country. Even just fifty years ago, the Aral Sea was such a big saltwater lake straddling the border between Uzbekistan and Kazakhstan. that it had to be called a sea. As the sea began to recede, it left fishing villages far from the water and revealed the strange contours of the Aral Desert and the Ustyurt Plateau. Ships were left stranded, gathered into and left to graveyards, communities that remembered the rich marshland ecosystems were suddenly surrounded by desert. A trip to the Aral Sea can be saddening, since it shows how much damage humans can create, yet the landscapes have an eerie and haunting beauty that will stay with you for long after you finish this tour.
